

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, several parties have indicated an interest in obtaining the tin cans located at the various dumps on the reservation for processing and resale to the copper plants, and

WHEREAS, the sale of the cans would aid in the control of rubbish on the reservation in addition to adding to the income of the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized to negotiate and sign a contract for a period of one year with whomever he deems to have made the best offer for the exclusive right to all tin cans located in dumps on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. Such contract must contain a clause requiring that the dump sites be maintained in the same condition as they were at the time loading of the cans commenced.

The foregoing resolution was on May 4, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
