

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on October 30, 1964, the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the United States Government entered into an agreement regarding the provisions of sanitary facilities for the Mutual-Help Indian Homes in the Diamond Creek Turn-Off Unit, Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the United States of America, Acting through the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, under the provisions of Public Law 86-121, agreed, upon the completion of the facilities, to transfer to the White Mountain Apache Tribe all facilities and their appurtenances, including all materials, supplies, and equipment provided for the benefit of the Tribe, and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe agreed to accept these said facilities as a property of the Tribe for the benefit of the Tribe so as to keep the facilities in an effective and operative condition, and

WHEREAS, the construction of the Mutual-Help Indian Homes in the Diamond Creek Turn-Off Unit is now complete.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman, for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, is hereby authorized to accept all of the Mutual-Help Indian Homes in the Diamond Creek Turn-Off Unit sanitation facilities from U. S. Public Health Service pursuant to Public Law 86-121.

The foregoing resolution was on June 17, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
