

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

HEREAS, there exists on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation an urgent need for simple housing for elder Tribal members whose only means of support are welfare or Social Security payments, and

HEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes this need and also realizes that attempts to obtain this housing through other public agencies has been without results, and

HEREAS, the lack of housing for these people represents a serious threat to their health and welfare.

IT RESOLVED that the sum of ten thousand dollars is hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit with the Treasurer of the United States to build ten housing units.

IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these units shall remain the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and shall be furnished to Tribal members on a need basis as determined by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
