

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Miss Margaret DeMarco, a VISTA volunteer presently working on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, has expressed her desire to extend her tour with VISTA for one year on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that there exists a need for a centrally located land office where all maps, plats, and information regarding land assignments is on file and information regarding unassigned land is readily available, and

WHEREAS, Miss DeMarco is a graduate engineer and has the capabilities to establish such an office.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby invites Miss DeMarco to remain on the reservation for one more year to establish such an office and requests VISTA to favorably consider extending Miss DeMarco's tour of duty here for one more year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be requested to furnish such supervision and technical assistance and guidance as may be necessary to establish such an office based upon their experience in establishing such offices on other reservations.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
