

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the community of Carrizo has never had an adequate bridge over Corduroy Creek to provide adequate ingress and egress to and from the village, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the need for said bridge, and

WHEREAS, the Council is of the opinion that the building of the bridge should take priority over the contemplated Maverick Road.

BE IT RESOLVED that the building of the said Carrizo Bridge is hereby substituted for the Maverick Road and is designated as No. 6 on the Priority for Roads on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Maverick Road is hereby designated as No. 7 Priority.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
