

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE has applied for a grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development to construct a Neighborhood Facility, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development by letter dated 6 July 1966 advised the Tribe that the sum of \$187,667.00 has been set aside for the construction of this facility, and

WHEREAS, it was the original intention of the Tribe to use the value of the land and the existing Alchesay Hall to pay a portion of the twenty five percent required of the Tribe, which value the Department of Housing and Urban Development has advised the Tribe would not be acceptable.

BE IT RESOLVED that the cost of the project be maintained at \$200,000.00 with the Tribal share of \$50,000.00 already appropriated in the 1966-67 budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alchesay Hall location site of the new building is hereby confirmed as shown on the drawing submitted by GOMEZ AND ASSOCIATES and that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign a contract between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and GOMEZ AND ASSOCIATES retaining them as engineers to prepare all necessary drawings, documents, and specifications and to supervise the overall construction of the project on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
