

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Whiteriver area is the most densely populated section of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, there are innumerable people in said area without water or sewage facilities, and

WHEREAS, this condition is conducive to poor health among the Apaches.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is directed to request U. S. Public Health Service to make an engineering study of the Whiteriver area to determine the cost and feasibility of installing a water and sewage system for the people residing therein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Public Health Service be further advised that the Tribe shall explore all possibilities of securing funds to help defray the cost of installation of the said water and sewage system.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
