

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution Number 60-71 passed October 14, 1960, limits the Christmas tree cutting on the Reservation to the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise, and

WHEREAS, this type of operation is not specifically stated in the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Plan of Operation, and


WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company is responsible for the removal of all timber products from the Tribal Sawmill Block, and


WHEREAS, it would be advantageous to the Tribe to permit the Fort Apache Timber Company to remove Christmas trees from the Sawmill Block and the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to remove Christmas trees on other Tribal lands.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Timber Company be permitted to remove Christmas trees from the Tribal Sawmill Block and the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to remove Christmas trees from other Tribal lands, and that the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise's Plan of Operation be amended as soon as possible to permit this type of operation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it will be necessary for these Enterprises to enter into an approved timber contract.

The foregoing resolution was on August 17, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
