

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a Cooperative Agreement with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service for predatory animal and rodent control on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the control of predatory animals is beneficial to livestock interest and game management programs on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the game management section has recommended that coyotes be controlled on the west side of the reservation through the application of 1080 bait stations, and


WHEREAS, the Predator Control Agent has agreed to place said stations.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife be requested to treat all of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation west of Cedar Creek by the placement of approximately forty (40) bait stations in 1966-67 winter season.

The foregoing resolution was on September 7, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
