

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Rudolph Kane has rendered many years of faithful service to the
White Mountain Apache Tribe as a policeman, and

WHEREAS, the house located in Cedar Creek, commonly known as the
Policeman's Quarters has been declared surplus and the Tribe
has no use for same.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribe hereby transfers and assigns said house,
without charge, to Rudolph Kane.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1966 duly adopted by a
vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White
Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article
V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe,
ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of
the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
