

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a tremendous land resource consisting of irrigated acreage, potential irrigated acreage and vast rangeland, and,


WHEREAS, these lands are fully utilized by members of the Tribe, and,

WHEREAS, the utilization of reservation lands does not approach the full agricultural potential that actually exists primarily because the Tribal members do not have the education or training in agricultural fields necessary for maximum production of these lands,

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests more assistance in the educational and training facets of all agricultural endeavors, including farming, homemaking, stockraising, irrigation and management.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
