

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the BIA Road System on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation consisting of 531 miles of dirt road and fourteen miles of paved road is inadequately maintained, and


WHEREAS, the poor condition of the system is a limiting factor in the development of industry, recreation potential, timber harvest, livestock production and mining, and

WHEREAS, an annual budget of \$100,000 is considered minimal to maintain this system and an additional 1 million dollars should be invested in road betterment projects during the next five years

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that every effort be made to obtain the necessary funds to maintain and upgrade the road system on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the control schedule for new road construction dated April 1966 be energetically pursued.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
