

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the recreational potential on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been rapidly developed during the past ten years and the operation of recreation facilities has become one of the major industries, and

WHEREAS, needs exist for additional facilities to serve the ever increasing number of recreation visitors coming to the area each year, and

WHEREAS, many other tribes have been encouraged to develop similar enterprises by the examples set on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the economy of both the local off-reservation areas and the state as a whole have benefited from the Indian recreation development,

BE IT RESOLVED that Congress be asked to provide more loan funds to be invested in recreational developments, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be encouraged to provide budget funds for public recreational and campground facilities on the various reservations, and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that consideration be given to permit Indian Tribes to participate, and receive directly from the Federal Government, matching funds from the various acts for the development of public recreational facilities.


The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (43 Stat. 984).
