

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the development and management of fishery and wildlife programs on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation by the Bureau of Sports, Fisheries and Wildlife has provided a base for a million dollar per year industry, and

WHEREAS, the potential for further developments in this area are virtually unlimited, and


WHEREAS, many other reservations and tribes have similar development potential,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the President of the United States, the Congress and the Secretary of the Interior be requested to provide adequate funds for the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife to carry out accelerated programs on the various reservations and provide additional assistance to the Indian Tribes.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1966 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934).
