

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 65-91, the Tribal Council established the priority for the building of sewerage and water facilities on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, in said resolution, Whiteriver has been designated as No. 4 priority, and

WHEREAS, there are many more residents in the Whiteriver area who are badly in need of the said facilities.

BE IT RESOLVED that the following amended priority is established for the construction of water and sanitation facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, to-wit:

1. Whiteriver
2. Cedar Creek
3. North Fork
4. East Fork
5. Fort Apache Junction
6. McNary

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions including, but without limitation, Resolution No. 65-41 and Resolution No. 65-91 established a priority for said sewerage and water facilities are hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be presented to the U. S. Public Health Service for future programming of the said facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, when he determines it feasible, is hereby authorized to consolidate any of the above projects.


The foregoing resolution was on January 4, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
