

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona, acting by and through its Highway Department has made application for a highway right of way 100 feet in width and 2.06 miles in length, across tribal lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and


WHEREAS, the right of way being requested is for the purpose of improving the Whiteriver to Indian Pine Highway #73 by realigning a portion of the highway and constructing a new bridge over Post Office Canyon and a new concrete structure over Round Top Wash.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that consent is hereby given to the granting of a highway right of way 100 feet in width and 2.06 miles in length, as delineated on map or definite location # D-9-T-228, to the State of Arizona.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results to the Tribe that will ensue by the improvement of Highway #73 and the construction of the bridges.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all asphalt be removed and the area reseeded over any lands which have been abandoned pursuant to this realignment.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
