

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has a Housing Improvement Program available to various Indian Reservations, subject to availability of funds, and

WHEREAS, this program is designed and directed towards Indian families who cannot qualify for any other Federal Housing Program, and


WHEREAS, the Bureau Home Improvement Program includes (1) RENOVATION AND ENLARGEMENT and (2) NEWLY CONSTRUCTED HOUSING: the first being an outright grant for the individual home owner and the second being new construction which will be turned over to the Tribe for management, maintenance and assignment of occupancy.

BE IT RESOLVED on this first day of March, 1967, that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council requests a Home Improvement Program and hereby accepts, without reimbursement, for Tribal ownership all newly constructed homes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council agrees to: (1) Manage, maintain and assign occupants. (2) Provide a gratuitous site, on which new houses will be constructed. (3) Provide casualty insurance on all new accepted houses. (4) Provide a manage and occupancy committee, which committee shall include the Agency Social Worker as a member and which committee will be designated and authorized to assign occupants, to establish a rent scale, pay the utilities and collect the rent.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
