WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the present Council chambers is too small to provide adequate seating facilities for members of the Tribe who desires audiences with the Council, and


WHEREAS, the present Tribal Council chambers was improperly designed in not providing for the Council members to be seated in a position to insure the dignity of the Tribal Governing Body, and


WHEREAS, there is a definite shortage of tribal business office space, and

WHEREAS, the present Council chambers can be converted into new office space.

BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby appropriated from tribal funds a sum not to exceed \$35,000.00 to construct a new Council chambers.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
