

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, employees of the Fort Apache Timber Company have no access to the place of employment from the west side, and

WHEREAS, a large portion of the workers live at Canyon Day and could greatly benefit by any access from the west, and

WHEREAS, the Branch of Roads in its future construction program contains provision for vehicular access across the Whiteriver Gorge, and this program would benefit from any walkway access constructional at this time.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Roads is hereby requested to construct a pedestrian crossing providing walking access from State Route 73 to the Fort Apache Timber Company mill.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
