

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 67-26 granted the Arizona Highway Department a right of way for the purpose of realigning a portion of State Highway 73 and constructing a new bridge over Post Office Canyon and a new concrete structure over Round Top Wash, and

WHEREAS, due to the realignment of the Whiteriver-Indian Pine Highway No. 73 it has become necessary for the Western States Telephone Company, Inc. to move some of their telephone poles.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that consent is hereby given to the granting of a right of way 20 feet in width and .363 miles in length, as delineated on map of definite location on file in the Superintendent's Office, Fort Apache Agency, to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Western States be required by the Superintendent to see any areas need reseeding as determined by the Tribal Chairman and the Superintendent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Western States also construct and maintain all fences and cattleguards as determined necessary by the Tribal Chairman and the Superintendent.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
