



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Arizona State University Department of Zoology has requested permission to conduct a five-week course in field zoology on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation between June 12, 1967 and July 3, 1967, and
- WHEREAS, the field party will consist of W. L. Minckley, PHD and nine students, and
- WHEREAS, the Department of Zoology has offered to cooperate with the White Mountain Apache Tribe by providing synoptic collection of animals and fishes and provide the Tribe with detailed reports of its research findings, and
- WHEREAS, the Game Management Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation will be materially benefitted by this cooperation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Recreation Enterprise Manager be authorized to issue such permits as are necessary to W. L. Minckley and the students to conduct the five-week course as outlined above.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Recreation Enterprise Manager be authorized to waive the purchase of tribal hunting and fishing permits for Dr. Minckley and the nine students if deemed appropriate.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
