

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the tribe is expending all available funds to develop both the natural and human resources on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Law and Order Branch of the tribe cost approximately \$100,000. per year, and

WHEREAS, the tribe could invest the said sum of \$100,000. and create many new jobs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby requested to assume the cost and management of the Law and Order of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona Congressional Delegation be informed of the wishes of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 19, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
