

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 65-20 the White Mountain Apache Tribe leased to the Bureau of Indian Affairs approximately 12.8 acres of ground to be used for a lagoon, pipeline and storage tank, and

WHEREAS, the water well that was drilled on the Cibecue School property did not produce the required amount of water, and

WHEREAS, additional wells were drilled off the Cibecue School property which requires additional rights-of-way for the waterlines and property for the water standpipe and water wells.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent is authorized and directed to grant a right-of-way to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for a period of 50 years from August 30, 1965, pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results that will ensue by the construction of the water wells and water pipelines.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
