

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is constructing eighteen (18) homes for low income families to be transferred to the Tribe, and


WHEREAS, the U. S. Public Health Service, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, has agreed to provide a water supply and waste disposal facilities for the eighteen (18) housing units near Whiteriver, and


WHEREAS, this will be a great benefit to many Apache families.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement for and on behalf of the Tribe with the Public Health Service, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, said agreement providing, among other things, that the U. S. Public Health Service shall be granted an easement to enter upon tribal lands and construct, install or otherwise provide the sanitation facilities provided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the easement shall be granted to the Public Health Service at no cost.

The foregoing resolution was on July 18, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
