RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 65-42 the Council arrived at nine preferences to be presented to U. S. Government under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, and

WHEREAS, the Committee and the Council have completed the statistical data and the applications necessary to effectuate and submit the following White Mountain Apache Tribe Community Action Program Components and Adult Education Program justifying a Conduct and Administration Component, and

WHEREAS, the Council desires that these seven packaged programs be expedited as quickly as possible.

BE IT RESOLVED that the seven following packaged programs and their preferences in chronological order are hereby established for the White Mountain Apache Tribe, to-wit:

1. Conduct and Administration Component
2. Head Start Program
3. High School Equivalency Component
4. Adult Education Program
5. Agriculture and Home Extension Service
6. Community Development
7. Nelson Amendment Project

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 65-70 is hereby amended to provide for the submitting of the application for the said seven programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes and directs the Chairman to sign all application blanks and any other necessary documents to enable the Tribe to participate in the said seven programs under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
