

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the present road system on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is not adequate to meet the needs for recreation and timber harvest, and


WHEREAS, the present East Fork Road from Webb Mill site to Rock Creek Ranger Station is extremely dangerous because of the congested traffic of log trucks, recreationist and local residents using this narrow poorly aligned road, and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Public Law 89-136, the United States of America has authorized the making of supplementary grants and/or loans to public bodies and private or public non-profit organizations or associations to aid in financing the construction of specific public projects.

BE IT RESOLVED that Ronnie Lupe, Chairman, or his authorized representative be authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe with the Economic Development Administration, U. S. Department of Commerce, for a supplementary grant aid in financing the reconstruction of this section of the road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Robert E. Robinson, Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the Economic Development Administration, U. S. Department of Commerce, may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
