

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 66-73 adopted by the Tribal Council on June 1, 1966, requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs include the proposed road from the Cibecue Bridge to the new Cibecue School in the Cibecue Road Project and that it be given first priority on the said Road Project, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has included the road from the Cibecue Bridge to the new school site in the Cibecue Road Project.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be granted a right-of-way .8 of a mile in length and 100 feet in width for construction of a road from the Cibecue Bridge to the new Cibecue School.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs determine the fencing needs along said route construction, furnish and install all fencing and replacing all fencing as may be removed by construction.

The foregoing resolution was on September 6, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
