

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, surveys indicate an increase in coyote and other predatory animal populations on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, it is the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to reduce and control predatory animal species to prevent losses of livestock and game animals, and

WHEREAS, the eastern half of the reservation has not been treated for predator control during the past two years.

BE IT RESOLVED that the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service is requested and herewith authorized to place forty compound 1080 control stations on that portion of the reservation east of U. S. Highway 60 during the 1967-68 winter season.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
