

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Deer Spring Canyon Logging Unit contract approved June 22, 1965, Cibecue Lumber Company, Purchaser, requires in 1967, a minimum cut of 7,500,000 board feet and a maximum cut of 9,000,000 board feet, and

WHEREAS, an unexcused cutting deficiency in 1966 raised the minimum and maximum cut for 1967 to 10,389,150 board feet and 11,889,150 board feet respectively, and

WHEREAS, the Purchaser has cut 8,872,890 board feet through September 30, 1967, and expects to cut the maximum allowable cut of 11,889,150 before December 31, 1967. Therefore, he has requested that the maximum cut for 1967 be extended to 13,889,150 board feet.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Maximum Allowable Cut for 1967 be extended to 13,889,150 board feet.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1967 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
