

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs have jointly constructed a new multiple purpose reservoir known as Sunrise Lake, and


WHEREAS, the construction of the reservoir involved the realignment and reconstruction of 19,500 feet of Arizona State Highway 273, and


WHEREAS, because of the short construction season and the necessity of completing the new highway prior to the filling of the reservoir in the spring of 1968, it was necessary to proceed with construction.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council approves the new highway alignment and hereby dedicates the necessary acreage for the right-of-way involved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council approves the application for right-of-way to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as attached, for subsequent transfer to the Arizona State Highway Department.

The foregoing resolution was on February 7, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (43 Stat. 984).
