WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the expressed desire of the Division of Indian Health to promote and support Indian involvement and participation in its programs and services, and


WHEREAS, it is also the sincere wish and desire of the various Tribal Health Committees from the States of Arizona, Utah, California, and Nevada to work closely and more effectively with the U. S. Public Health Service, and


WHEREAS, it is the earnest wish of the tribe that the recommendations of the Eighth Annual Tribal Leaders Health Conference be adopted by the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED

- (1) That the Division of Indian Health has our undivided encouragement and support in obtaining funds toward providing additional hospitals, clinics, and facilities; and
- (2) That, there will be more involvement of the tribal health committees and tribal councils in policy-making, program planning, and carrying out of programs and services for the Indian beneficiaries; and
- (3) That, tribal health committee delegates be permitted increased opportunity to participate in structuring and helping with future health conferences; and
- (4) That, the Division of Indian Health be responsive to local complaints concerning the availability of physicians for service and care of Indian beneficiaries during times of emergency; and
- (5) That, the Division of Indian Health help to promote the setting up of Indian Scholarships for students to entering into the field of health, and, finally,
- (6) That, the Division continue to provide funds for the continued operation of adult health education programs and services.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
