FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are some septic tanks and leach lines servicing homes on the reservation which are inadequate, and


WHEREAS, this creates a health and sanitation problem.


BE IT RESOLVED that the sanitation engineer of the U. S. Public Health Service of Whiteriver, Arizona is qualified to determine the adequacy of septic tanks and leach lines.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sanitation Engineer of the U. S. Public Health Service, Whiteriver, Arizona is hereby authorized and requested to approve the specifications of all newly constructed homes on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all permits, leases, loans or agreements of any kind shall be approved for the construction of homes on the reservation with the prior approval of the specifications of the septic tanks and leach lines servicing homes by the Sanitation Engineer of Whiteriver, Arizona, U. S. Public Health Service.

The foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
