

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 68-49, among other things, provided that all artifacts and other materials taken by the Northern Arizona University would become the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe if and when a suitable museum was established on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, artifacts will be taken from other areas than the reservation, and


WHEREAS, it was the intention in said resolution that only artifacts and other materials removed from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation would become the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 68-49 is hereby amended by deleting the second RESOLVED part of said resolution and substituting therein the following:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all artifacts and other materials removed from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation will become the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe if and when a suitable museum is established on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
