

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Federal Government has restricted the amount of money budgeted for the Head Start Program, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will have to deny some twenty-four five-year old worthwhile students in the Head Start training unless the Tribe appropriates sufficient additional funds to operate the Head Start Program, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is extremely interested in the education of its youth.

BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of \$9,054.00 is hereby appropriated from Tribal funds on deposit with the United States to defray the educational cost of operating the Head Start Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 4, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
