

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are several gaps in the economic and social development of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, these deficiencies lie primarily in the fields of poor access to natural resources and the need for additional full time employment, and


WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration was established to assist redevelopment areas in economic development.

BE IT RESOLVED that applications be made to the Economic Development Administration for funds to develop the following projects:

1. Fort Apache Timber Company Road System.
2. Geronimo Trail Extension.
3. Cibecue Iron Mine Access Road.
4. Small log processing plant.
5. Moulding and cut stock plant.
6. Recreation area access and utility system.
7. Whiteriver and Cibecue street and sewer system.
8. McNary sewer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aid and support of the Four Corners Regional Commission and the Indian Development District of Arizona be sought in developing these projects.

The foregoing resolution was on September 16, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
