WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Michael W. Everett, a graduate student of the University of Arizona, appeared before the Tribal Council to request permission to study the Medical Service System on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Everett has been recommended by Mr. Keith H. Basso of the University of Arizona, and


WHEREAS, Mr. Everett states that he will move to Whiteriver along with his family for a period of one year to consult with the members of the Tribe and others in regards to the Medical System Survey.


BE IT RESOLVED that permission is hereby granted to Mr. Michael W. Everett to carry out a Medical System Survey on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Everett will work closely with the Health, Education and Welfare Committee of the Tribal Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Everett will provide the Tribe with a copy of the survey along with his recommendations for the improvement of the medical services within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
