

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe established the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise in 1954 to establish recreational facilities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe now has approximately 700 established campgrounds on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, fishing man days are approximately 400,000 annually, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe now expends in excess of \$50,000.00 per year for maintaining and operation of campgrounds, and

WHEREAS, a survey has been carried out by David Evans and Associates throughout the State of Arizona showing that a great majority of the public would be willing to pay a reasonable camping fee to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to improve and properly maintain all campgrounds on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that April 1, 1969, camping fees will be charged as follows:

Overnight Camping per car	\$0.75
Season long camping (change site every ten days)	5.00
Season long one single assignment site	30.00



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that complimentary permits may be issued to reservation residents and persons employed on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
