

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has long had a program to establish community centers within each community on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has provided funds to the Cibecue, Carrizo, Cedar Creek, Canyon Day, East Fork, Seven Mile, Whiteriver and North Fork Communities for construction of community buildings, and

WHEREAS, the Indian community in McNary has an organized community improvement association and have shown efforts in the past by constructing a community center, and

WHEREAS, this center is not considered adequate by the Tribal Council due to lack of sanitary facilities and laundry.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the amount of \$5,770.00 is hereby appropriated from funds on deposit in the Treasury of the United States for construction of an addition to the present McNary Community Center including sanitary bathing facilities and a laundry in accordance with plans submitted to the Tribal Council by Charles A. Patterson, Apache Construction Company, Whiteriver, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
