

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it will be impossible to maintain the Cibecue Day School, John F. Kennedy Day School and the Theodore Roosevelt Boarding School without additional funds, and

WHEREAS, the low standard of living prevailing among the Apache people is primarily due to the lack of educational facilities and teachers in the past, and


WHEREAS, the proper education of the Apache youth, will in the future, be a tax saving, and

WHEREAS, the inadequacy of the funds will also affect the health of the children who depend on the food furnished them at the said schools.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Congress of the United States and the Bureau of Budget provide \$153,786.00 additional funds for the current fiscal year to operate the Cibecue Day School, John F. Kennedy Day School and the Theodore Roosevelt Boarding School.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1968 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
