



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, sometime ago, Henry Armstrong, Sr. released his three-acre dry farmland assignment in Cedar Creek in order that a school could be constructed on said site, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe and the Bureau moved his house from the said premises, and in addition, reconstructed the house and made additions thereto and classified said welfare house a home, and
- WHEREAS, the welfare portion of the house became part and partial of the said Henry Armstrong, Sr.'s residence, and
- WHEREAS, due to the death of Henry Armstrong, Sr., the Tribal Council, at its Regular Council Meeting, June 5, 1968, reassigned said house to Timothy and Irene Ethelbah, and
- WHEREAS, Julius Armstrong, son of Henry Armstrong, Sr., has requested that the house be again reassigned to the estate of the late Henry Armstrong, Sr. and further requests that he be granted a three-acre farmland assignment, and
- WHEREAS, a suitable living quarters must be provided for Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbah.
- ✓ BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby appropriated from Tribal Funds on deposit in the U. S. Treasury Department, the sum of \$1200.00 to be used to construct a welfare house for Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbah.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as soon as said house is constructed and made livable, that Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbah shall move from the Armstrong house to the new quarters.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the construction of the said new quarters for Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbah and upon their moving to the said quarters, that the former Henry Armstrong, Sr.'s house be reassigned to the estate of Henry Armstrong, Sr.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Land Committee is hereby directed to find three acres available farmland and to report to the Tribal Council at its next regular meeting, the location of said land for assignment to the estate of Henry Armstrong, Sr.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
