

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requested Raymond Kane to present to it a Community Health Representative Program Proposal, and


WHEREAS, the inadequate health facilities, the lack of a health indoctrination program and a shortage of personnel has prevailed upon the Fort Apache Indian Reservation almost since its inception, and

WHEREAS, the Community Health Representative Program Proposal as presented by Mr. Kane is well drafted and has great merit.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council unanimously endorses the said Community Health Representative Proposal and hereby directs the Tribal Chairman to sign any and all documents, including, but without limitation, a contract agreement with the U. S. Public Health Service Indian Health Division to consummate the program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be instructed to contact the Arizona Congressional Delegation to support the necessary funding for the program.

The foregoing resolution was on January 8, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
