

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, continuing game surveys made by the Tribal Game Department indicate that mule deer populations are down due to losses during the severe winter storms in 1967 and 1968, and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a temporary refuge will aid in restoring the herds to their former numbers, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors has made recommendations for a closure of a portion of the I. D. Range.

BE IT RESOLVED that the area commonly known as the I. D. winter range be closed to hunting, except for bear, predatory animals and non-game animals, for a period of two years beginning July 1, 1969.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the exact boundaries of the closed area be designated by the Enterprise Manager and that appropriate signs be installed.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958,
