


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has maintained a long-term project for the preservation of the Apache Native Trout, and

WHEREAS, in order to propagate and preserve this rare specie, it is necessary to close Sun and Moon Creeks to fishing.

BE IT RESOLVED that Sun Creek and Moon Creek, from their confluence to the source, be designated as closed waters and that no fishing be permitted in these creeks until this Resolution is rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
