

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, many of the White Mountain Apache people live in unsanitary and unsafe wickiups and other huts, and

WHEREAS, many of these people would qualify for Federal Low-Rent Housing Units, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe almost four years ago requested the Federal Housing Administrator to authorize the funding so that low-rent houses could be constructed on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, Chairman Lupe has been in contact with certain Federal Agencies regarding the construction of Low-rent houses, and

WHEREAS, many of the White Mountain Apaches still in dire need of low-rent houses.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and/or the Superintendent and/or the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority are hereby requested and directed to make application and sign any and all necessary documents with the proper governmental agency for the building of thirty five (35) low-rent houses on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Navajo County, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on March 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
