

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a large volume of reservation timber classified as being of small diameter, and

WHEREAS, a recently completed feasibility study recommends as feasible and economic, a small log processing plant to profitably process this small diameter timber, and

WHEREAS, such a small log processing plant would not only help to alleviate the shortage of housing lumber by adding an estimated twenty four (24) million board feet of lumber into the housing market, but would also provide permanent employment opportunity for many of the Tribal people, help to raise their standard of living and give them a sense of responsibility, and

WHEREAS, an application for grant and loan funds, to help construct this small log processing plant, has been prepared and submitted to the Economic Development Administration.

BE IT RESOLVED that assistance be requested from Arizona's Senators and Congressmen to encourage the Economic Development Administration to press the processing of the aforementioned application for grant and loan funds to an early and successful completion so that this small log processing plant, may become a reality in the very near future.

The foregoing resolution was on May 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
