

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Highway Department has requested permission to explore gravel and sand deposits on Carrizo and Corduroy Creeks between the village of Carrizo and the Carrizo bridge on U. S. Highway 60, and

WHEREAS, the site immediately above the Carrizo bridge on U. S. Highway 60 has previously been used as a source of road building materials.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council approves the request of the Arizona Highway Department to explore in the areas designated by the plat on file in the Office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if exploration of the designated sites proves as adequate quality and quantity of material, the Superintendent and the Tribal Chairman are then authorized to negotiate a permit for the removal of these materials provided the following stipulations and requirements are met:


1. The areas below pit site #1212 and the Carrizo bridge be reclaimed as far as possible. Level all piled up materials in the old pit site and reseed an adapted grass species.
2. A buffer zone of trees be kept between the proposed pit sites and the hill on the east of Carrizo-Corduroy Creeks.
3. Material be obtained from the channel areas insofar as possible so that future high flows will replace the materials removed.
4. Upon completion of material removal, the streams shall be rechanneled and any necessary reclamation work, including leveling, seeding and tree and brush removal shall be performed.
5. The Tribe or Bureau of Indian Affairs shall be allowed to use free of charge all rejected material that is run through the crusher and also be free to contract for the purchase of manufactured material, if desired.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona Highway Department pay the tribe the following rates computed on a tonnage basis for the removal of said sand and gravel, to wit:

Five cents (5¢) per ton for all borrow; ten cents (10¢) per ton for all select, ABC, MA; and fifteen cents (15¢) per ton for all screenings.

The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
