

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Joe Tony Jaquez and Claude Boddie are non-members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, said Joe Tony Jaquez was convicted in Federal Court of Unlawfully killing and butchering a steer on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and implicating Claude Boddie as an accessory, and

WHEREAS, their presence on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is believed to be injurious to the people of the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that Joe Tony Jaquez and Claude Boddie be excluded from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be mailed to Southwest Forest Industries at McNary and copies be mailed to Joe Tony Jaquez and Claude Boddie at their last known address and that Joe Tony Jaquez and Claude Boddie shall have thirty days from the date of mailing to appeal this action to the Tribal Court. In case an appeal is taken said person or persons are not to be excluded until final determination by the Tribal Court.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (q) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
