

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Apache Railway Company has applied for a permit for cinders in the area commonly known as the McNary Cinder Pit an area 200 yards by 250 yards consisting of approximately 15 acres, and

WHEREAS, it is considered to be to the economic advantage of the Tribe to sell these cinders to the Apache Railway Company.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council Chairman is hereby authorized to execute a non-exclusive permit to Apache Railway Company, McNary, Arizona, for the purchase of cinders from the McNary Cinder Pit. The description of which is on file in the Superintendent's Office, Fort Apache Indian Agency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Apache Railway Company shall pay not less than the appraised value and the permit shall be for a period of five (5) years beginning upon the receipt of the appraisal and execution of the permit.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
