

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Western States Telephone Company has applied for a right-of-way from the Theodore Roosevelt School to the East Fork Mission, and

WHEREAS, this reconstruction is necessary due to the widening, grading and surfacing of the road by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, Western States Telephone Company has properly filed application and proper documents with the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Western States Telephone Company be granted a gratuitous right-of-way for the said telephone poles and lines pursuant to the map on file in the Superintendent's Office, Fort Apache Indian Agency, to which reference is hereby made.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right-of-way shall be 20 feet in width and 11.114 miles in length.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Western States Telephone Company agrees to comply with the following stipulations:

- (a) To construct and maintain the right-of-way in a workmanlike manner.
- (b) To pay promptly all damage, in addition to the deposit made pursuant to 25 CFR 161.5, determined by the Superintendent to be due to the landowners on account of the construction and maintenance of the right-of-way.
- (c) To indemnify the landowners against any liability for damages to life or property arising from the occupancy or use of the lands by the applicant.
- (d) To restore the lands as nearly as may be possible to their original condition upon the completion of construction.
- (e) That the applicant will not interfere with the use of the lands by or under authority of the landowners for any purpose not inconsistent with the primary purpose for which the right-of-way was granted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this right-of-way shall be granted for a period of twenty-five (25) years.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
