

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Game and Fish Department and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service is cooperating in a project to establish a resident population of Canada geese in the White Mountain Area, and

WHEREAS, the area immediately east of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been closed to goose hunting in order to protect the marked birds which were planted for nesting purposes, and


WHEREAS, some of the marked geese have been observed on the reservation in the vicinity of Sunrise Lake and east of State Highway 273, and


WHEREAS, the establishment of a resident goose population in the White Mountain area will be beneficial to the Game Management Program on the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that all of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation east of the new alignment of State Highway 273 be closed to goose hunting during the 1969 season.

The foregoing resolution was on September 3, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
